**The Mission:** The purpose of these "action research teams" is to involve students in a process of experiential learning by collaborating with faculty, staff, administration, and community members to **implement tangible change** at our university. The Course: The Education for Sustainable Living Program is an interdisciplinary effort to realize sustainable community throughout the University of California. Weekly seminars by renowned authors and progressive thinkers explore aspects of sustainability ranging from green chemistry to the role of spirituality in our community. Ultimately we aim to inspire participants to internalize the concept of sustainability and apply it in practice to life.

The course will be offered **Spring Quarter 2011.** Students who enroll in the seminar receive 2 units and those who participate in "action research teams" receive 4 units. Leaders of "action research teams" are eligible to earn up to 4 units of academic credit.
