Rental income will commence upon occupancy of SCHA's initial house in mid-October, 1979. A fund-raising event will be held upon the occasion of the ribbon cutting.

Additional fundraising efforts include a book sale which realized \$402, and a garage sale planned for late September, 1979.

SCHA directors will be meeting with several Bay area foundations in the fall of 1979 to discuss receiving additional grants to fund both current and future projects.

Present SCHA activities include developing low cost housing for students and needy Davis residents, and providing education to the public about low cost and energy efficient housing.

Low Cost Housing Development

In cooperation with local architects and with solar builder/developer Mike Corbett SCHA has designed a model solar home which is now under construction in the nationally recognized Village Homes sub division of Davis. The home features solar space heating and cooling, solar water heating, and wheelchair access throughout the first floor. It will house from eight to ten persons.

Construction of the house has been financed through loans to Corbett by SCHA, Guild Savings and Loan, and the Village Homes Owners Association. Completion of construction is sheeduled for mid-October, 1979, at which time SCHA will assume operating control under a lease with Corbett. SCHA will have an option to buy the property from Corbett as soon as purchase financing is finalized.

Residency in this house as well as in future housing owned or leased by SCHA will be restricted to persons qualifying as either students or low income under Federal guidelines (see attached statement, item III (8) (b).)

Charitable grants, loans and donations of services and labor have all reduced the cost of this initial project, and thus made more feasible the provision of low cost housing to residents. The utilization of solar design concepts, although increasing nitial costs, will also serve to reduce monthly utility expenses of the occupants.

Educational Activities

SCHA organized and presented a class in Spring of 1979 through the Experimental College program of UC Davis. Guest speakers from Berkeley and Sacramento led seminars on topics including solar design, self-build construction, and student housing development. The class was publicized and open to the general public.

Future Activities will include:

- (1) Obtaining charitable grants and loans sufficient to negotiate actual purchase of the initial SCHA designed home.
- (2) Developing additional low cost housing units in Davis.

Duties of the Directors are described in the By-Laws, Article III.

(3) Continuing to organize seminars and other educational activities relating to low income and student housing concerns.

RESIDENCY POLICY

In order to promote the goal of providing housing to low income Davis residents, the following policy has been adopted by the SCHA Board:

- (1) At all times 75% of the residents of housing owned or leased by SCHA shall be either students in a recognized institution of higher education, or persons or families qualifying as lower income under the guidelines established by the Department of HUD for Yolo County for its Section 8 housing program.
- (2) The Board shall set up appropriate procedures to ensure that the above residency requirements are met.

The above policy statement was adopted unanimously by the Board of Directors of the Solar Community Housing Association at the Board meeting of May 14, 1979.
