- The 2016 Census showed Canada's population at 35,151,728 persons which amounted to an increase of 1,675,040 persons (5.0%) since the 2011 census. Canada's 2011 population was 33,476,688.
- In 2016, nearly 24.9 million people, or more than seven-tenths of Canadians, were living in census metropolitan area.
- Ontario's 2016 population of 13,448,494, is an increase of more than 596,600 more than the 12,851,821 reported in 2011 for a 4.6% increase.
- The Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) with a population of 5,583,064 in 2011 grew 6.2% to 5,928,040 in 2016.
- Mississauga; Canada's 6th largest city; had a population increase of 1.1% from 2011 to 2016. Mississauga's 2016 population of 721,599 increased by 8,156 residents from 713,443 in 2011.
- Mississauga is Ontario's 3rd largest city surpassed only by the cities of Toronto and Ottawa.

- Mother Tongue is defined as the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the census.
- Canada has two official languages, English and French. 98% of Canada's population can speak one or both of the official languages and in Mississauga this is marginally lower at 96%.
- Mississauga has a diversity of linguistics.

- Persons whose language spoken at home other than English or French make up 11.5% of Canada's total population, in comparison to 14.4% of Ontario's population, 24.7% of the Toronto CMA's population and 26.2% of Mississauga's population.
- The Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) of Toronto includes all of Metropolitan Toronto and surrounding areas, including the Regions of Peel and York and a large portion of the Regions of Halton and part of the Region of Durham.


