

**ORPHANAGE WORK
TOLD IN REPORT**

Hundred and Ninety Children Received at Institution and 158 Find Homes by Adoption.

It was reported at the annual meeting of the trustees of the Arkansas Methodist Orphanage that more than \$30,000 had been invested in the building at Sixteenth and Elm streets, Little Rock. The work of the orphanage for the past year was found to have been more satisfactory than at any time previously. Up to the present time 190 children have been received into the institution and 158 have been placed in homes where they have been adopted.
