

LANGSTON'S TRIAL BEGINS TOMORROW

About 15 Witnesses From North
Dakota Will Testify He Was
There on Day Shirey
Was Killed.

Walnut Ridge, Oct. 2.—The trial of J. C. Langston for the murder of A. W. Shirey at Minturn on March 8 will open here Tuesday morning before Judge Coffin of Newport.

About 15 witnesses from South Dakota who will testify that Langston was in that state on the day Shirey was killed, will be here to testify. In addition there will be about 15 other witnesses. It is expected that 10 days or possibly two weeks will be consumed in the trial.

X. O. Pindall of Little Rock, Bill Smith of this place, Attorney Hooper of Gregory, S. D., and Attorney Harrington of Nebraska will represent Langston while Prosecuting Attorney Love Grant, Judge M. M. Stuckey of Newport, George Gibson of Walnut Ridge, Fred Lutz of Newport and Attorney Simpson of Paragould will prosecute the case.

Shirey was wealthy and left a large amount of money, estimated at about \$250,000 to the Odd Fellows lodge of Arkansas. A settlement was effected after his murder, however, by which his widow and the lodge split the fortune.
