A. H. Proctor, who was cashier of the same bank at the time the doors were closed, is also under indictment, and his trial also is scheduled for this term of court. Proctor was indicted on two counts and Morgan on three.

Another case in which interest is being taken is the case of the State of Arkansas against Mose Thompson. Thompson is charged with murder in the first degree, for the killing of Bob Weir, a neighbor, near Black Rock, some three months ago. Thompson was bound over to await the action of the grand jury at the coming term of court, immediately after the killing. The trouble was brought on between the two men by Weir's alleged attentions to Mrs. Thompson. Thompson's plea will be, it is stated, the "unwritten law."

There are a number of minor criminal cases on call for this term, and the defendants are under bond to appear for trial. Some of them are the case of the State vs. Percy Doyle, for arson and burglary; State vs. Elmas Dunham, Ed Sharp and Homer Sharp, for burglary and receiving stolen property.

The civil docket is the largest for a number of years.
